Day 01 : CHENNAI ARRIVAL - LOCAL SIGHTSEEING

Upon your arrival at Chennai Railway Station, our representative will warmly welcome you and assist you with your transfer to the hotel. After enjoying a delicious breakfast at the hotel, begin your pilgrimage by exploring Chennai, the vibrant capital of Tamil Nadu and a city renowned for its rich cultural heritage, ancient temples, and colonial history. Your first stop will be the Kapaleeshwarar Temple, one of Chennai's most sacred temples dedicated to Lord Shiva. Built in the magnificent Dravidian architectural style, the temple is famous for its towering gopuram adorned with colourful sculptures depicting scenes from Hindu mythology. According to legend, Goddess Parvati worshipped Lord Shiva here in the form of a peacock, making this temple an important pilgrimage site for devotees seeking divine blessings. The temple's peaceful atmosphere, beautifully carved pillars, and sacred tank make it a truly spiritual experience. Later, proceed to the Parthasarathy Temple, one of the 108 Divya Desams dedicated to

Dating back to the 8th century, this ancient temple is admired for its remarkable Dravidian architecture, intricate carvings, and deep religious significance, attracting thousands of devotees throughout the year. Continue your sightseeing with a visit to the world-famous Marina Beach, the second-longest urban beach in the world. Stretching along the Bay of Bengal, Marina Beach offers a refreshing atmosphere with its golden sands, cool sea breeze, and panoramic coastal views. It is one of Chennai’s most iconic landmarks and an ideal place to relax while enjoying the scenic beauty of the coastline. If time permits, visit the magnificent San Thome Basilica, built over the tomb of St. Thomas the Apostle, making it one of the most important Christian pilgrimage sites in India. The church beautifully reflects Chennai’s religious harmony and architectural elegance. In the evening, you may explore the nearby local markets, where you can shop for traditional handicrafts, brass idols, devotional items, and the world-famous Kanchipuram silk sarees before returning to the hotel. Day 02 : CHENNAI - KANCHIPURAM - TIRUVANNAMALAI

After enjoying a wholesome breakfast at the hotel, check out and begin your journey towards Kanchipuram, located approximately 75 kilometres from Chennai. Revered as one of the Sapta Puri (Seven Sacred Cities) of India, Kanchipuram is popularly known as the “City of Thousand Temples” and has been a prominent centre of Hindu spirituality, learning, and culture for over a thousand years. Besides its spiritual importance, the city is world-famous for its exquisite handwoven Kanchipuram Silk Sarees, admired for their rich craftsmanship and elegance. Your first visit will be to the Sri Kamakshi Amman Temple, one of the most revered Shakti Peethas in South India, dedicated to Goddess Kamakshi, an incarnation of Goddess Parvati. The temple is believed to have been established by Adi Shankaracharya and is an important pilgrimage destination for devotees seeking prosperity, wisdom, and marital bliss. The beautifully sculpted sanctum and peaceful atmosphere offer a deeply spiritual experience. Continue to the magnificent Ekambareswarar Temple, one of the sacred Pancha Bhoota Sthalams, representing the Earth Element (Prithvi). Dedicated to Lord Shiva, this temple is famous for its towering Rajagopuram, expansive temple complex, and the legendary 3,500-year-old mango tree under which Goddess Parvati is believed to have worshipped Lord Shiva. The temple stands as a remarkable example of traditional Dravidian architecture and spiritual grandeur. Next, visit the Sri Varadaraja Perumal Temple, one of the 108 Divya Desams dedicated to Lord Vishnu. Renowned for its intricately carved stone pillars, majestic halls, and sacred rituals, the temple is an architectural masterpiece built during the Chola and Vijayanagara periods. Devotees from across the country visit this temple to seek the blessings of Lord Varadaraja for peace, prosperity, and good fortune. Your final stop in Kanchipuram will be the historic Kailasanathar Temple, the oldest temple in the city and one of the finest surviving examples of Pallava architecture. Dedicated to Lord Shiva, this magnificent sandstone temple is admired for its beautifully sculpted shrines, intricate carvings, and serene surroundings, offering visitors a glimpse into Tamil Nadu’s glorious architectural heritage. After completing the temple visits and enjoying lunch en route (at your own expense), continue your scenic drive to Tiruvannamalai, one of the holiest pilgrimage centres dedicated to Lord Shiva. Dominated by the sacred Arunachala Hill, the town is revered as one of the Pancha Bhoota Sthalams, representing the divine Fire Element (Agni). It has attracted saints, sages, and spiritual seekers from around the world for centuries and is widely regarded as a place of self-realisation and inner peace. Upon arrival, check in to the hotel and relax after the day’s journey. The peaceful atmosphere of Tiruvannamalai provides the perfect

Day 03 : TIRUVANNAMALAI - LOCAL SIGHTSEEING

After a delightful breakfast at the hotel, embark on a spiritually enriching day exploring the sacred town of Tiruvannamalai, one of the holiest pilgrimage destinations in India and a place revered by saints, sages, and devotees for centuries. Nestled at the foothills of the sacred Arunachala Hill, Tiruvannamalai is considered one of the Pancha Bhoota Sthalams, representing the Agni (Fire) Element, where Lord Shiva is worshipped as Arunachaleswarar. According to Hindu mythology, Lord Shiva manifested here as an infinite column of fire to demonstrate His supremacy before Lord Vishnu and Lord Brahma. This divine event is celebrated every year during the world-famous Karthigai Deepam Festival, when a gigantic flame is lit atop Arunachala Hill, attracting millions of devotees from across the globe. Begin your pilgrimage with the magnificent Sri Arunachaleswarar Temple, one of the largest and most impressive temple complexes in India, spread across nearly 25 acres. The temple is renowned for its towering Rajagopurams, intricately carved mandapams, majestic thousand-pillared hall, sacred tanks, and beautifully sculpted shrines dedicated to Lord Shiva and Goddess Unnamulai Amman. Devotees from around the world visit this temple to seek divine blessings, perform special poojas, and experience the powerful spiritual vibrations believed to remove obstacles, grant inner peace, and guide seekers towards self-realisation. After seeking blessings at the temple, proceed to the renowned Sri Ramana Maharshi Ashram, one of the world's most respected spiritual centres. Established in memory of the great sage Bhagavan Sri Ramana Maharshi, the ashram welcomes seekers from across the globe who come to practise meditation, silence, and self-enquiry through his profound teaching of "Who Am I?" Surrounded by peaceful gardens and a serene atmosphere, the ashram provides the perfect environment for reflection and spiritual contemplation. Continue your visit to the Sri Seshadri Swamigal Ashram, dedicated to the revered saint Sri Seshadri Swamigal, affectionately known as the "Saint with the Golden Hand." The ashram preserves his legacy and serves as a peaceful retreat where devotees gather to offer prayers and seek spiritual guidance. Later, visit the Yogi Ramsuratkumar Ashram, dedicated to the beloved saint Yogi Ramsuratkumar, whose teachings of devotion, simplicity, and surrender continue to inspire countless followers from around the world. In the evening, devotees may choose to perform the sacred Girivalam (Giri Pradakshina), a revered 14-kilometre circumambulation around the holy Arunachala Hill. It is believed that walking barefoot around the hill with sincere devotion helps cleanse negative karma, brings inner peace, fulfils heartfelt prayers, and bestows the abundant blessings of Lord Arunachaleswarar. Along the Girivalam path, devotees encounter numerous ancient shrines, sacred Lingams, meditation spots, and spiritual landmarks that further enhance the divine experience. Day 04 : TIRUVANNAMALAI - CHIDAMBARAM - KUMBAKONAM

After an early breakfast, check out from the hotel and proceed towards the sacred town of Chidambaram, one of the most important Shaivite pilgrimage centres in India. Located amidst the lush greenery of the Cauvery Delta region, Chidambaram is renowned for its spiritual significance and is home to the world-famous Sri Nataraja Temple, where Lord Shiva is worshipped as Nataraja, the Cosmic Dancer. This ancient temple is one of the most revered Shiva temples in the country and represents the Akasha (Space) Element among the sacred Pancha Bhoota Sthalams. The temple beautifully symbolizes the eternal cycle of creation, preservation, and destruction through Lord Shiva's divine cosmic dance. Upon arrival, visit the magnificent Sri Nataraja Temple, an architectural masterpiece spread across nearly 40 acres. The temple is adorned with majestic gopurams, intricately carved stone sculptures, spacious courtyards, and beautifully decorated mandapams that reflect the grandeur of the Chola dynasty. One of the temple's greatest mysteries is the famous Chidambara Rahasyam (The Secret of Chidambaram), where the divine presence of Lord Shiva is believed to exist in the form of empty space, symbolizing the formless and omnipresent nature of the Almighty. Devotees visit this sacred shrine seeking spiritual enlightenment, wisdom, and liberation from the cycle of birth and death. After seeking the blessings of Lord Nataraja, continue your journey towards Kumbakonam, one of Tamil Nadu's holiest temple towns, often referred to as the "Temple City of South India." Nestled along the banks of the sacred River Cauvery, Kumbakonam is home to hundreds of ancient temples and is considered one of the most important pilgrimage destinations for devotees of Lord Shiva and Lord Vishnu. According to Hindu mythology, during the great deluge (Pralaya), Lord Brahma's divine pot (Kumbha) carrying the seeds of creation came to rest here, giving the town its name "Kumbakonam." Continue to the famous Sarangapani Temple, one of the 108 Divya Desams, dedicated to Lord Vishnu in a reclining posture. The temple is admired for its chariot-shaped sanctum, intricate carvings, and rich religious heritage. If time permits, visit the sacred Mahamaham Tank, one of India's most revered temple tanks, where the grand Mahamaham Festival is celebrated once every twelve years. It is believed that taking a holy dip here washes away sins and brings divine blessings. After an enriching day filled with sacred temple visits, check in to your hotel and relax amidst the peaceful atmosphere of Kumbakonam. Prepare for the following day's special pilgrimage to the renowned Navagraha Temples, an experience that holds immense astrological and spiritual significance for devotees.

Day 05 : KUMBAKONAM - NAVAGRAHA TEMPLE TOUR

After an early breakfast at the hotel, embark on a spiritually enriching pilgrimage to the renowned Navagraha Temples, one of the most unique and sacred temple circuits in India. Located in and around Kumbakonam, these nine ancient temples are each dedicated to one of the Navagrahas (Nine Planetary Deities)—Surya (Sun), Chandra (Moon), Angaraka (Mars), Budha (Mercury), Guru (Jupiter), Shukra (Venus), Shani (Saturn), Rahu, and Ketu. According to Hindu astrology, the Navagrahas have a profound influence on every individual's life, and visiting these temples is believed to reduce planetary doshas, remove obstacles, improve health, bring prosperity, and bestow peace, success, and happiness. Begin your pilgrimage with the Suriyanar Temple, dedicated to Lord Surya (Sun God). This is the only temple in India where Lord Surya is the principal deity, accompanied by all the other

Navagraha deities within the same temple complex. Devotees visit this sacred temple to seek blessings for good health, vitality, confidence, and success in life. Continue to Thingalur Chandran Temple, dedicated to Lord Chandra (Moon God), where devotees pray for emotional well-being, peace of mind, mental strength, and harmony in family life. The serene atmosphere of the temple provides a deeply calming spiritual experience. Proceed to Vaitheeswaran Koil, dedicated to Lord Angaraka (Mars). The temple is also famous as the abode of Lord Vaidyanathar (Lord Shiva as the Divine Healer) and is believed to possess miraculous healing powers. Thousands of devotees visit this temple seeking relief from illnesses, courage, strength, and protection from the adverse effects of Mars. Your journey continues to Thiruvengkadu Budhan Temple, dedicated to Lord Budha (Mercury). This sacred shrine is believed to bless devotees with intelligence, wisdom, education, excellent communication skills, and success in academics and business. The temple is also renowned for its beautifully sculpted architecture and tranquil surroundings. Next, visit Alangudi Guru Temple, dedicated to Lord Guru (Jupiter), where devotees seek divine blessings for knowledge, prosperity, marriage, children, and spiritual progress. The temple is considered highly auspicious for those experiencing Guru Dosha and is one of the most visited Navagraha temples in Tamil Nadu. Continue to Kanjanur Sukran Temple, dedicated to Lord Shukra (Venus). This sacred temple is believed to bless devotees with wealth, luxury, happiness, marital harmony, artistic talents, and material prosperity. The temple is unique as Lord Shiva himself is believed to embody the power of Lord Shukra. The pilgrimage then proceeds to Thirunallar Saneeswaran Temple, one of the most famous temples dedicated to Lord Shani (Saturn). Devotees from across India visit this temple to perform special prayers seeking relief from Shani Dosha, Sade Sati, and other astrological challenges. It is believed that sincere worship at this temple removes hardships and brings stability, peace, and success in life. Next, visit Thirunageswaram Rahu Temple, dedicated to Lord Rahu, where devotees seek relief from Rahu Dosha and obstacles affecting health, marriage, career, and family life. The temple is especially famous for the miraculous phenomenon during the milk abhishekam, where the milk offered to Rahu is believed to change colour while flowing over the deity. Finally, conclude the Navagraha pilgrimage at Keezhaperumpallam Ketu Temple, dedicated to Lord Ketu. Worship at this temple is believed to remove the negative effects of Ketu Dosha, enhance spiritual growth, and bless devotees with wisdom, inner peace, and liberation from past karmic influences. After completing this sacred Navagraha Yatra, return to Kumbakonam. In the evening, you may spend some leisure time exploring the traditional streets of the temple town, famous for brass lamps, bronze idols, silk textiles, and authentic South Indian delicacies. Day 06 : KUMBAKONAM - THANJAVUR - TRICHY

After breakfast at the hotel, check out and proceed towards Thanjavur (Tanjore), one of Tamil Nadu’s most historic cities and the former capital of the mighty Chola Empire. Widely regarded as the cultural and architectural heart of South India, Thanjavur is renowned for its magnificent temples, classical music, traditional paintings, and rich artistic heritage. The city flourished under the Chola dynasty, whose remarkable contributions to temple architecture continue to inspire visitors from around the world. Upon arrival, visit the world-famous Sri Brihadeeswarar Temple, popularly known as the Big Temple, a magnificent masterpiece built by the great Chola King Rajaraja Chola I in the 11th century. Recognised as a UNESCO World Heritage Site under the “Great Living Chola Temples,” this architectural marvel is dedicated to Lord Shiva and is considered one of the finest examples of

Dravidian temple architecture. Constructed entirely from granite, the temple features a towering 216-foot Vimana, one of the tallest temple towers in the world, an enormous monolithic Nandi carved from a single stone, beautifully sculpted corridors, intricate frescoes, and remarkable inscriptions that narrate the glorious history of the Chola Empire. The temple stands as a timeless symbol of devotion, engineering excellence, and artistic brilliance. After seeking the blessings of Lord Brihadeeswarar, continue your journey to Tiruchirappalli (Trichy), one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in India and an important spiritual centre situated on the banks of the sacred River Cauvery. Trichy is home to some of the country's most revered temples and attracts millions of pilgrims every year. Your first visit will be to the magnificent Sri Ranganathaswamy Temple at Srirangam, the largest functioning Hindu temple complex in the world and one of the 108 Divya Desams dedicated to Lord Vishnu. Spread across nearly 156 acres, the temple is enclosed by seven concentric walls and features 21 majestic gopurams, including the impressive Rajagopuram, one of the tallest temple towers in Asia. Lord Ranganatha is worshipped here in a reclining posture on the divine serpent Adishesha, and devotees believe that seeking His blessings brings prosperity, peace, and spiritual fulfilment. The temple's grand corridors, intricately carved pillars, vibrant festivals, and centuries-old traditions create an unforgettable spiritual experience. Continue to the sacred Jambukeswarar Temple at Thiruvanaikaval, one of the revered Pancha Bhoota Sthalams, representing the Water Element (Appu). Dedicated to Lord Shiva, this ancient temple is unique because the Shiva Lingam is constantly surrounded by a natural underground water spring, symbolising the presence of the water element. The temple is admired for its peaceful atmosphere, beautiful stone carvings, and deep spiritual significance. If time permits, conclude the day's sightseeing with a visit to the iconic Rockfort Temple, one of Trichy's most famous landmarks. Perched atop a 3.8-billion-year-old rock, the temple offers breathtaking panoramic views of Trichy city and the River Cauvery. The hill houses the Ucchi Pillayar Temple, dedicated to Lord Ganesha, and the Thayumanaswamy Temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva. Climbing the ancient rock-cut steps is considered a spiritually rewarding experience, and the view from the summit is truly unforgettable. After an enriching day exploring the architectural grandeur and sacred temples of Thanjavur and Trichy, check in to your hotel. Spend the evening at leisure before retiring for the night. Day 07 : TRICHY - MADURAI

After a delicious breakfast at the hotel, check out and proceed towards Madurai, one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world and the cultural capital of Tamil Nadu. Fondly known as the "Temple City" and the "Athens of the East," Madurai boasts a history spanning over 2,500 years and has long been a flourishing centre of Tamil literature, art, architecture, and spirituality. Situated on the banks of the Vaigai River, the city has been ruled by the Pandya, Chola, Vijayanagara, and Nayak dynasties, each leaving behind a remarkable legacy of temples, monuments, and traditions. Upon arrival, begin your sightseeing with the magnificent Sri Meenakshi Amman Temple, one of the most celebrated and revered temples in India. Dedicated to Goddess Meenakshi (an incarnation of Goddess Parvati) and Lord Sundareswarar (Lord Shiva), this architectural masterpiece is admired for its 14 towering gopurams, intricately carved sculptures, colourful mythological figures, and vast temple complex spread across nearly 15 acres. The temple is believed to have been rebuilt during the Nayak period and attracts millions of devotees and visitors from across the world every year. Inside the temple, admire the sacred sanctums, beautifully decorated corridors, the famous Golden Lotus Tank (Porthamarai Kulam), and the spectacular Thousand Pillar Hall,

where every pillar showcases the extraordinary craftsmanship of ancient Tamil artisans. The temple’s divine atmosphere, daily rituals, and vibrant spiritual energy make it one of the most significant pilgrimage destinations in South India. Later, visit the majestic Thirumalai Nayakkar Mahal, a grand 17th-century palace built by King Thirumalai Nayak. This architectural marvel is an outstanding blend of Dravidian and Indo-Saracenic styles, featuring towering pillars, magnificent arches, spacious courtyards, and beautifully decorated halls. The palace reflects the grandeur of the Nayak dynasty and offers visitors a glimpse into the rich royal heritage of Madurai. Continue your sightseeing with a visit to the sacred Koodal Azhagar Temple, one of the 108 Divya Desams, dedicated to Lord Vishnu. The temple is renowned for its beautiful architecture and the unique representation of Lord Vishnu in three different postures—standing, sitting, and reclining. Devotees believe that worshipping here brings prosperity, harmony, and divine blessings. If time permits, you may also visit the Gandhi Memorial Museum, one of India’s most significant historical museums dedicated to the life and teachings of Mahatma Gandhi. The museum houses rare photographs, manuscripts, personal belongings, and historical exhibits related to India’s freedom movement, providing visitors with valuable insights into the nation’s history. In the evening, return to the Meenakshi Amman Temple to witness the mesmerizing Evening Aarti (Palliarai Ceremony), a centuries-old ritual during which the idol of Lord Sundareswarar is ceremoniously taken in a grand procession to the shrine of Goddess Meenakshi. Accompanied by devotional chants, traditional music, and temple rituals, this sacred ceremony creates an unforgettable spiritual experience and beautifully reflects the deep-rooted traditions of Tamil Nadu. After an inspiring day filled with devotion, history, and architectural splendour, check in to your hotel and relax. The remainder of the evening is at leisure to explore Madurai’s vibrant local markets, famous for traditional handicrafts, brass artefacts, temple souvenirs, Madurai cotton textiles, and authentic South Indian delicacies. Day 08 : MADURAI - PALANI - RAMESWARAM

After an early breakfast, check out from the hotel and begin your journey towards the sacred hill town of Palani, one of the most revered pilgrimage destinations dedicated to Lord Murugan. Nestled amidst the picturesque Palani Hills, this holy town is home to the famous Arulmigu Dhandayuthapani Swamy Temple, one of the Arupadai Veedu (Six Sacred Abodes) of Lord Murugan. Perched atop a hill at an elevation of approximately 500 feet, the temple attracts millions of devotees every year who come seeking blessings for good health, wisdom, prosperity, and spiritual well-being. Upon arrival, ascend the hill by Rope Car, Winch Railway, or by climbing the sacred steps (at your own expense and subject to operational availability) to reach the temple. According to Hindu mythology, after the divine contest for the sacred fruit of wisdom, Lord Murugan chose Palani as His abode, teaching the profound message that “Knowledge is the greatest wealth.” The temple houses the unique idol of Lord Murugan, believed to have been created by the great sage Bhogar using the mystical Navapashanam, a rare combination of medicinal herbs and minerals. Devotees believe that worshipping here removes obstacles, grants peace, and fulfils heartfelt wishes. After seeking the blessings of Lord Dhandayuthapani Swamy, descend the hill and continue your scenic drive towards the holy island town of Rameswaram, one of the most sacred pilgrimage destinations in India and one of the Char Dham pilgrimage sites. En route, enjoy the changing landscapes of Tamil Nadu before crossing the iconic Pamban Bridge, India’s first sea bridge connecting mainland India to Rameswaram Island. The breathtaking views of the turquoise waters, fishing boats, and the vast Bay of Bengal make this one of the most memorable stretches of

the journey. Upon arrival in Rameswaram, proceed to the world-renowned Sri Ramanathaswamy Temple, one of the Twelve Jyotirlingas of Lord Shiva and among the holiest temples in Hinduism. According to the Ramayana, Lord Rama worshipped Lord Shiva at this sacred place after his victory over Ravana and established the Shiva Lingam to seek forgiveness and blessings before returning to Ayodhya. The temple is globally renowned for its magnificent 1,200-metre-long pillared corridors, considered the longest temple corridors in the world, its impressive Dravidian architecture, beautifully sculpted pillars, and profound spiritual significance. Devotees may also perform the sacred rituals at the 22 Holy Theerthams (Sacred Wells) located within the temple complex (rituals are optional and at personal expense). It is believed that taking a holy bath in these sacred wells cleanses the body, mind, and soul while washing away past sins. Later, visit the sacred Agni Theertham, situated along the seashore opposite the temple, where pilgrims traditionally take a holy dip before offering prayers at the temple. After completing the temple darshan and experiencing the spiritual atmosphere of Rameswaram, check in to your hotel. Spend the remainder of the evening at leisure or explore the peaceful surroundings of this sacred island town before retiring for the night. Overnight Stay: Rameswaram

Day 09 : RAMESWARAM - DHANUSHKODI - KANYAKUMARI

After an early breakfast at the hotel, check out and begin your day with a visit to the mystical town of Dhanushkodi, located at the southeastern tip of Pamban Island, approximately 20 kilometres from Rameswaram. Surrounded by the turquoise waters of the Bay of Bengal on one side and the Indian Ocean on the other, Dhanushkodi is one of the most unique and spiritually significant destinations in India. Once a thriving coastal town, it was devastated by the catastrophic cyclone of 1964 and is now famously known as the “Ghost Town of India.” Despite its abandoned appearance, the town remains an important pilgrimage destination deeply connected with the epic Ramayana. According to Hindu mythology, this is the sacred place where Lord Rama, after rescuing Goddess Sita from Lanka, instructed Lord Hanuman and the Vanara Sena to dismantle a portion of Ram Setu (Adam’s Bridge) using the tip of His divine bow, giving the place its name “Dhanushkodi,” meaning “End of the Bow.” Visit the Ram Setu View Point, where devotees can witness the legendary stretch believed to have connected India and Sri Lanka. You will also explore the remains of the old church, railway station, post office, and other structures that silently narrate the history of the once-flourishing town. The serene coastline, endless blue waters, and peaceful surroundings make Dhanushkodi a truly unforgettable destination. After completing the sightseeing, proceed towards Kanyakumari, the southernmost tip of mainland India, enjoying a scenic drive through picturesque villages, lush coconut groves, and beautiful coastal landscapes. Upon arrival, begin your sightseeing with the revered Bhagavathi Amman Temple, dedicated to Goddess Kanyakumari, an incarnation of Goddess Parvati. The temple is one of the 108 Shakti Peethas and is believed to bless devotees with strength, prosperity, and spiritual fulfilment. Later, visit the iconic Vivekananda Rock Memorial, situated on a rocky island in the midst of the sea. It is here that Swami Vivekananda is believed to have meditated in December 1892 before embarking on his mission to spread the message of Indian spirituality across the world. Accessible by ferry (subject to operational timings and weather conditions), the memorial offers breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding oceans and serves as a symbol of peace, inspiration, and national pride. Adjacent to the memorial stands the majestic 133-foot Thiruvalluvar Statue, dedicated to the great Tamil poet and philosopher Saint Thiruvalluvar, whose timeless work, the Thirukkural, continues to inspire people around the world with its teachings on virtue, wealth, and love. Continue your visit to

the Gandhi Memorial Mandapam, built at the site where the ashes of Mahatma Gandhi were kept for public homage before immersion. The memorial has been uniquely designed so that on 2nd October every year, the sun’s rays fall directly on the exact place where his ashes were placed. Conclude your day at the sacred Triveni Sangam, where the Arabian Sea, Bay of Bengal, and Indian Ocean meet. This unique confluence is one of the most beautiful natural attractions in India and is considered highly auspicious by pilgrims. If time permits and weather conditions are favourable, witness the spectacular sunset over the three oceans, creating an unforgettable visual experience and providing the perfect conclusion to your divine pilgrimage through Tamil Nadu.
